## The Gifted and Academically Talented Program

We are proud of the high level of family and community involvement in our school. It supports a culture and climate of respect for both cultural and academic diversity where the talents of all are developed and celebrated. In effect, ours is not just a school, but a family of learners.

We are committed to supporting our students before, during, and after their years under our care. Collaborative planning occurs between our sister schools, R.V. Daniels and James Weldon Johnson, to provide cohesive continuity in a child's school career.

Susie E. Tolbert Elementary offers a variety of resources and activities to enrich and deepen a child's learning experiences. These include but are not limited to:

- **Rainforest Alliance Project** is a unique program to R.V. Daniels and Susie E. Tolbert Elementary, where we are the first schools in the State of Florida to fully implement this program. The Rainforest Alliance has a thoroughly developed curriculum teaching students to value and respect our natural world and resources. This program is supported and funded through the Weaver Foundation. Rainforest Alliance activities are imbedded across the curriculum to provide children with valuable and enriching experiences that enhance grade level standards.
- **Interest clubs and classes** including art, chorus, peer counseling, physical education, Media, Music, Newspaper, and Yearbook provide students with opportunities to improve their communication skills and express their talents. *(Please note these activities may vary year to year due to funding).*
- **Television Production Lab** where students can produce the WTES morning news broadcast and creative media projects.
- **Community helpers program** where students apply for specific jobs as part of our school community including serving as media aides, delivery and clerical assistants, and peer counselors outside of instructional time.
- **Field trips** selected and designed to enhance all curricular areas and broaden your child's perspective. Exploration and discovery-based activities support the academic and cognitive strands that are specifically identified for exemplary gifted education as outlined by the NRC/GT (National Research Center on the Gifted and Talented).

- **Curriculum** builds upon and extends beyond the general curriculum as students' needs dictate. Rigorous and challenging curriculum is enhanced through the study of universal concepts, complex levels of generalizations, and essential questions. Students are consistently engaged in multiple, complex, and thought-provoking texts/materials that challenge what they think and feel about curricular concepts and their world. Application is made to real-world situations.
- **Instructional delivery** employs a variety of research-based strategies and methods from various curricular models that emphasize skills such as inquiry, investigation, and experimentation. Students are regularly provided with opportunities for understanding the "whys" through scholarly dialogue/discussions and they reflect on concepts, generalizations, and essential questions encountered with rigorous texts and materials. The teacher constantly probes students to deepen meaning and to provide rationale for positions.
- **Multiple assessments** are used to consistently monitor students' growth and understanding of increasingly complex materials, ideas, issues, and problems. The teacher provides opportunities for students to reflect on understanding and growth. Assessments match the level of rigor and relevance identified in the learning objectives.
